# Bubbles

To me Champagne, indeed all sparkling wine, is one of the greatest simple pleasures in life. One of the biggest myths in the world is that bubbly is only for special occasions... that's nonsense! Bubbles can make any occasion special. Moreover Champagne and sparkling wines are perfect with food, with any food; one can have an entire meal with nothing but bubbles... from all over the world! A Franciacorta from the hills of Lombardy, a gorgeous Blanc de Blancs from California, a cuvée de prestige from Champagne's Grand Cru vineyards... and finally, finish off with a demi-sec. The possibilities are endless. Great sparkling wine is made using the "méthode champenoise" or "Classic method" whereby the 'second fermentation' of the still wine, where the bubbles actually get created, happens in the very same bottle being served to you.

Once the second fermentation is finished, the wines are left to age on their "lees," or the yeast cells which give the wine its richness and character. Most age for fifteen months to well over ten years, depending on the blend or cuvée.

Further machine or manual riddling, a process whereby the dead yeast cells of that second fermentation slowly fall to the neck of the bottle and are then removed to create a pure crystal-clear sparkling wine, the bottles are kept in the winery's cellar for a little bit longer before they are released.

Most bubbly is a non-vintage product, meaning they are a mix of different growing seasons which are blended to create and exhibit a Champagne house's style. In great years, the wine of that year is kept separate and a vintage-dated wine is made. On spectacular years, these wines are elevated to the rare and luxurious "Cuvées de Prestige" –cheers!

## A little bit about California...

Mexican missionaries brought the first grapes into California just before the incoming storm known to history as the gold rush. Appropriately, the sacramental grape was known as the "Mission grape." It was a rather uninteresting variety that produced equally uninteresting wine. It was the little Mission of Sonoma which would beget the California wine industry. Here a self-proclaimed aristocrat and agriculturalist, Count Augustos Harazthy, founded Sonoma's first winery in his estate of Buena Vista. Across the Mayacamas further inland, in what is now Napa Valley, George Yount was granted close to 12,000 acres by California's de-facto Governor, General Vallejo. The 'ranch' of land that was given to Yount was called Rancho Caymus.

## Sauvignon Blanc Napa Valley

Naturally where 'Cab' reigns king so too must one of its botanical "parents" the Sauvignon Blanc. For far too long Napa Sauvignon Blanc was flat, oaked beyond recognition and, plainly speaking, unpalatable. Nowadays, thanks to stainless steel fermenters and better viticulture, Napa's Sauvignon Blancs have that wonderful racy acidity so loved in Sancerre but here, it is paired with that unmistakable kiss of California's sun which gives them a bright tropical plumpness. Change is good.

Although there has been a small back lash at this style, in my opinion growing stronger every day, Napa's big round manner still lives strong

## A little bit about California...

Napa's wine pioneer, George Yount, would give his name to part of his Rancho Caymus land grant calling it Yountville. His daughter married a young man who brought the train to the small watering hole-cum-town that would in turn take his name (the land given to him as a wedding-present from Yount's Rancho Caymus). The young man was Thomas Rutherford. Yount's own estate was split-up on his death and bought by a Dutch fur trader Gustave Niebaum, who called it Inglenook, now known as the Niebaum-Coppola Estate. The other half went to a Frenchman Georges de Latour, who called it Bealieu Vineyards. By the early 1900's, modern Napa was taking shape. On the other side of the Mayacamas the mission of Sonoma had proclaimed its independence and crowned itself the capitol the California Republic, raising the bear flag in the town square for the first time in history. A man named Cyrus Alexander planted extensive vineyards in a remote area of Sonoma valley... later called Alexander Valley. But by the time the dark cloud of Prohibition lowered and raised, only 160 of California's 700 wineries remained. Fewer than 50 wineries in Sonoma County survived. Nevertheless the twin-valleys would soon be flooded by the families who gave it its second chance at life, names like Wente, Krug, Beringer, Martini, Gallo and later Mondavi. The rest is history...

## Pinot Noir

"It's a hard grape to grow... it's thin-skinned, temperamental, ripens early.... it's not a survivor like Cabernet, which can just grow anywhere and thrive even when it's neglected. No, Pinot needs constant care and attention, in fact it can only grow in these really specific, little, tucked away corners of the world. Only the most patient and nurturing of growers can do it, really. Only somebody who really takes the time to understand Pinot's potential can then coax it into its fullest expression. Then, I mean, oh its flavors, they're just the most haunting and brilliant and thrilling and subtle and... ancient on the planet."

But in more judicious and dedicated hands Napa Merlot can reach levels of silkiness and dark beauty seldom achieved in New World wines.

## Washington State

In 1962 a group of university students from Seattle founded Associated Vintners, initially as a weekend hobby. They went commercial in 1967 and eventually changed their name to Chateau St. Michelle, currently Washington's largest winery and landholder. Today Washington is an experimental ground for countless wineries turning out some wonderful Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, and Syrah with vineyards like Ciel du Cheval and Seven Hills making a name for themselves on the international wine-map. Washington reds have an unequivocal sense of place with dark lingering flavors of fruit and earth.

## Bordeaux Blend: Meritage

In 1988 a handful of California wineries (Dry Creek, Bealieu Vineyards and Diamond Creek among them) founded the "Meritage Association." Meritage is a made-up name from the two words "Merit" and "Heritage" (and is indeed pronounced the way one would pronounce heritage not the French *hèrmitage*). The association wanted to promote the virtues of Bordeaux-style blended wines (i.e. Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Petit Verdot etc). Technically to be a true a 'Meritage' wine the winery must belong to the association. Meritage wines have a sense of 'completion' where, ideally, one grape picks up where the other grape leaves off. The point: the whole is greater than the sum of its parts... see for yourself.

## Syrah/Petite Sirah

Originally a Persian grape from the Middle-Eastern town of Shiraz, the Syrah grape thrives in the sun-kissed vineyards of California. Syrah, in the near past, laid mostly ignored in California, covered under a vinous blanket of a valley washed in Cabernet Sauvignon and Chardonnay. But, after some astounding successes, California Syrah is destined to be the area's "other red grape." Distinctively different from Australian Shiraz but it still contains those haunting aromas of baking spice, pomegranate and dark licorice (with a hefty chunk of stewed fruit) which makes fans of the Aussie stuff shiver in anticipation. Watch The Golden State's Syrah, because its about to get better.

Conventional thought has it that when Harazthy ordered his cutting form a nursery in Long Island, they were supposed to send him Hungarian Pinot Noir but, alas they did not, instead they sent him the grape that is today Zinfandel—it's name stemming from Pinot Noir's Hungarian alias Blauer Zierfandler.
