Now There's a *Westworld* Vacation Package in Colorado Just in Time for the Season 2 Premiere

Fans of the HBO hit sci-fi series can now live in the reality of their favorite show at Gateway Canyons Resort & Spa with this themed vacation package

The second season of *Westworld* premieres on April 22 and one Colorado resort is looking to give mega-fans the ultimate themed getaway. Set on the border between Colorado and Utah—incidentally, where much of the series is shot—Gateway Canyons Resort & Spa is offering guests their version of a wild west amusement park through what their calling the "Westworld Package." The option comes complete with everything

from horseback riding and a dinner by campfire light; a choice of one of three Wild West resort activities (skeet shooting, archery, or laser tag); a Native Massage for two at The Spa at Gateway Canyons; and thoughtful touches like cigars and ingredients for DIY Moscow Mules and sherry cocktails. It's apt that the resort itself was started by John Hendricks, the founder and former chair of the Discovery Channel, because the package is teeming with adventure and discovery.

Fans hoping to get a taste of the Wild West life via the Westworld Package will shell out \$999 per night for a double-occupancy room and are required to reserve a minimum three-night stay between May 1 and September 30, 2018. There are three main kinds of rooms available, ranging from Premium Casitas (several of which feature fireplaces and a separate second-floor den, as well as outdoor showers and private decks with fire pits), Kiva Lodge rooms (situated around Gateway Canyons's pool and clubhouse courtyard), and the Kayenta Lodge rooms, which give guests the full spa experience with deep tubs in addition to fireplaces and private patios. Additionally, the connected dude ranch offers more than 500 acres of horseback riding trails that climb over 1,500 feet in elevation.
